








World Book Day

Students of class 5 happily participated in the assembly on ‘Value of Time’ held on 26 sept 2023.




What can you do in Ramadan?



INDIAN NAVIGATION SYSTEM

Mr.Mathew

NavIC (Navigation with Indian Constellation) is India's own navigation system, better than U.S. GPS (Global Positioning System) navigation system. It covers India and a region extending 1500 km around it. NavIC will provide a standard positioning system for civilian purposes and a restricted service for military use. The need for indigenous navigation satellite system arose when Indian military faced problems during the Kargil war, which was dependent on the US global positioning system (GPS). It works based on the Indian Regional Navigation Satellite System (IRNSS).

NavIC satellites use dual frequency bands (L5-band and S-band), which is why the system is relatively more accurate than GPS (uses a single band and makes compensation for error due to signal deterioration by the atmosphere). In NavIC there are currently eight IRNSS satellites in geosynchronous and geostationary orbits. Seven satellites are being used for navigation purposes and one satellite only for messaging purposes.

NavIC can reach an accuracy of up to 5-10 meters whereas GPS is generally believed to have an accuracy of up to 20m. Not just the accuracy, but NavIC is said to have a faster latch-on time, which is technically referred to as Time To First Fix (TTFF).

Sam Manekshaw

Sam Manekshaw is widely recognized as one of India's most distinguished and celebrated military leaders. He holds the distinction of being the first Indian Army officer to be promoted to the rank of Field Marshal, the highest military honor in the country. Born on April 3, 1914, in Amritsar, Punjab, he belonged to a Parsi family and had a lifelong interest in medicine. However, he joined the Indian Military Academy in Dehradun in 1932 as an act of rebellion against his father. After the partition of India in 1947, he chose to continue serving in the Indian Army and played an active role in the 1947 Indo-Pakistani War and the Hyderabad crisis. He rose through the ranks and held several crucial positions, including Director of Military Training, Commandant of the Defense Services Staff College, and General Officer Commanding of various corps and commands. In 1969, he became the Chief of the Army Staff of the Indian Army and faced many challenges, including the Sino-Indian border dispute, the Naxalite insurgency, and escalating tensions with Pakistan. He meticulously prepared the army for a potential war with Pakistan and advocated for a diplomatic and political solution. In December 1971, he led the Indian Army to a decisive victory over Pakistan, resulting in the surrender of over 90,000 Pakistani troops and the establishment of a new nation, Bangladesh.

He is recognized for his exceptional leadership and bravery and was awarded the Padma Vibhushan, India's second-highest civilian honor, in 1972. He retired from active service in 1973, following a distinguished career spanning four decades and five wars. In 1973, he was conferred with the rank of Field Marshal, the only Indian Army officer to receive this prestigious title to date. Sam Manekshaw was a legendary figure who inspired generations of soldiers and civilians alike. He was a man of integrity, wisdom, humor, and charisma, and a true patriot who loved his country and served it with honor. He was known as Sam Bahadur (Sam the Brave), the Field Marshal who played a pivotal role in creating Bangladesh.

Vitamin A- Important for normal vision, the immune system, reproduction and growth and development.

Sources- Leafy green vegetables [kale, spinach, broccoli], orange and yellow vegetables [carrots, sweet potatoes, pumpkin and other winter squash, summer squash], tomatoes, red bell pepper, cantaloupe, mango, beef liver, fish oils, milk, eggs.

Vitamin B-Maintains good health and well being. It has a direct impact on your energy levels, brain function and cell metabolism .Vitamin B complex help prevent infections and help support or promote cell health.

Sources- Meat, fish, milk, cheese, eggs, some fortified breakfast cereals.

Vitamin C – It is also known as ascorbic acid. It has several important functions . These include helping to protect cells and keeping them healthy, maintaining healthy skin, blood vessels, bones and cartilage.

Sources-Citrus fruit, such as orange and orange juice, peppers, strawberries, blackcurrants, broccoli, Brussels sprouts, potatoes.

Vitamin D-It is a fat-soluble vitamin that has long been known to help the body absorb and retain calcium and phosphorus both are critical for building bone. Also laboratory studies show that vitamin D can reduce cancer cell growth, help control infections and reduce inflammation.

Sources- salmon, mackerel, sardines, egg, red meat and liver.

Vitamin E- It is a nutrient that's important to our vision, reproduction and the health of your blood, brain and skin. Vitamin E also has antioxidant properties.

Sources- wheat germ oil, sunflower, safflower and soybean oil, sunflower seed, almonds, peanuts, peanut butter, beet greens, collard green, spinach, pumpkin, red bell pepper.

Vitamin K- It helps to make various proteins that are needed for blood clotting and the building of bones. Prothrombin is a vitamin K- dependent protein directly involved with blood clotting. Osteocalcin is another protein that requires vitamin K to produce healthy bone tissue.

Sources- phylloquinone, green leafy vegetables including collard and turnip greens, kale, spinach, broccoli, brussels sprouts, cabbage, lettuces, soybeans and canolo oil, menaquinones, natto [fermented soybeans] smaller amounts in meat, cheese and eggs.
